Weekly Current Affairs (26th July– 1st August,2024)

- Shri H.D. Kumaraswamy, Union Minister of Steel and Heavy Industries, launched SIMS
 2.0, the upgraded Steel Import Monitoring System. Shri Bhupathiraju Srinivasa Varma, Minister of State for Steel and Heavy Industries, Shri Nagendra Nath Sinha, Secretary, Ministry of Steel, and other senior officials from the Government of India were present at the moment.
- President Droupadi Murmu has renamed two important halls in Rashtrapati Bhavan, formerly known as 'Durbar Hall' and 'Ashok Hall', to 'Ganatantra Mandap' and 'Ashok Mandap' respectively. This change is part of ongoing efforts to reflect Indian cultural values and ethos within the President's official residence.
- 3. India's installed nuclear power capacity is set to increase from 8,180 MW to 22,480 MW by 2031-32, according to Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh. The announcement was made in a written reply to an unstarred question in the Rajya Sabha. Dr. Singh also highlighted India's commitment to achieving net-zero emissions by 2070 and projected a need for a national nuclear capacity of approximately 100,000 MW by 2047.
- In a significant milestone for India's community radio landscape, Union Minister of Information and Broadcasting Ashwini Vaishnaw inaugurated the country's 500th community radio station, Apna Radio 90.0 FM, at the Indian Institute of Mass Communication (IIMC) in Aizawl, Mizoram.

This event underscores the government's commitment to the Act East policy and marks a key development in enhancing local communication and information dissemination.

- 5. AU Small Finance Bank's board has approved a proposal to transition from a Small Finance Bank (SFB) to a universal bank. This decision aligns with the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) guidelines issued on August 1, 2016, and the circular on voluntary transition of SFBs to universal banks dated April 26, 2024. A fourmember Committee of Directors has been formed to oversee the application process, with HR Khan, the bank's part-time Chairman and Independent Director, serving as Chairperson.
- 6. On July 25, 2024, Union Minister of Coal and Mines, Shri G. Kishan Reddy, launched the Vriksharopan Abhiyan 2024 at Bharat Coking Coal Limited (BCCL) in Dhanbad. This initiative, part of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" campaign, was simultaneously conducted across 300 locations in 47 districts within 11 coal/lignite-bearing states.
- On July 25, 2024, a significant milestone was achieved in India's community radio landscape. Union Minister for Information and Broadcasting, Ashwini Vaishnaw, announced the winners of the 10th National Community Radio Awards and inaugurated the country's 500th Community Radio Station. The event was graced by the presence of Mizoram's Chief Minister, Lalduhoma, marking the importance

of this occasion for both national and regional development in communications.

- The Town Official Language Implementation Committee (TOLIC) honored Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) in Visakhapatnam with the 'Rajbhasha Gaurav Samman' for the year 2023-24. The event was hosted by NTPC and was presided over by Atul Bhatt, Chairman of TOLIC and CMD of RINL.
- 9. The Indian Army contingent has embarked on its journey to participate in the multinational military exercise KHAAN QUEST 2024. This prestigious event is scheduled to take place from 27th July to 9th August 2024 in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. The exercise serves as a platform for military forces worldwide to collaborate and enhance their peacekeeping capabilities.
- 10. The Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research (AMD), a unit of the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), has identified lithium resources in the Mandya and Yadgiri districts of Karnataka. Union Minister of State Dr. Jitendra Singh announced the discovery of 1,600 tonnes (G3 stage) of lithium in the Marlagalla area of Mandya district. Preliminary surveys and limited subsurface exploration were also carried out in Yadgiri district.
- 11. Mankind Pharma has entered into a definitive agreement to acquire a 100 per cent stake in Bharat Serums and Vaccines (BSV) from Advent International. It is one of the world's largest and most experienced private equity investors, for an enterprise value of Rs 13,630 crore, subject to closing related adjustments.
- 12. Every year on July 26, India observes Kargil Vijay Diwas to commemorate the brave hearts of the Indian Army and celebrate the victory of the Indian Armed Forces over Pakistan during the 1999 Kargil Conflict. This day holds significant importance in India's military history, marking the successful conclusion of Operation Vijay.
- 13. Hamzah Haz, the vice-president of Indonesia from 2001 to 2004, has died. He was aged 84. Hamzah, who served under President Megawati Soekarnoputri, died at a

hospital in Jakarta on July 24, a politician from the Development Planning Party, known as PPP, said in a locally televised interview.

- 14. Vasai-based Catholic priest Father Francis D'Britto, writer and environmentalist, who translated the Bible into Marathi, passed away on July 25, 2024, after prolonged illness. D'Britto (81) breathed his last at his home in Vasai in Palghar district.
- 15. On July 27, 1939, the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) was established as the Crown Representatives Police in response to political turmoil within princely states. It has since evolved into a key central paramilitary force of India, playing a critical role in maintaining internal security. The force was renamed the Central Reserve Police Force on December 28, 1949, following a legislative act, and now operates under the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- 16. The Department of Posts has released a commemorative postage stamp at Dras, Kargil in Ladakh, marking the Silver Jubilee of Kargil Vijay Diwas. This special edition celebrates the 25th anniversary of India's victory in the Kargil War, acknowledging the exceptional bravery, determination, and sacrifice of the armed forces.
- 17. Veteran filmmaker Shekhar Kapur, known for films such as "Mr India", "Bandit Queen" and "Elizabeth", has been appointed festival director for the International Film Festival of India (IFFI). Mr. Kapur will head the festival, held annually in Goa, for the 55th and 56th editions, the Information and Broadcasting Ministry said in a notification.
- 18. The Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) is set to develop India's first integrated agricultural export facility at Jawaharlal Nehru Port in Mumbai. The project, approved by the Union Minister for Ports, Shipping, and Waterways, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, is valued at Rs. 284.19 crore and will cover an area of 67,422 square meters. This state-ofthe-art facility aims to streamline logistics, reduce multiple handling, and extend the shelf life of agricultural products, thus enhancing the export capacity of Indian agricultural commodities.

- 19. The All-India Consumer Price Index for Agricultural Labourers (CPI-AL) and Rural Labourers (CPI-RL) (Base: 1986-87=100) saw an increase of 11 points each in June 2024, reaching 1280 and 1292, respectively. The year-on-year inflation rates based on CPI-AL and CPI-RL were 7.02% and 7.04%, respectively, compared to 6.31% and 6.16% in June 2023. For May 2024, these rates were 7.00% for CPI-AL and 7.02% for CPI-RL.
- 20. The Centre has introduced a revised Model Skill Loan Scheme, designed to provide financial support for skill development courses to the nation's youth. Launched on July 25, by Jayant Chaudhary, Minister of State for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Education, the scheme aims to remove financial barriers to advanced skill education.
- 21. In a bold move that could reshape the landscape of internet search, **OpenAI**, the company behind the revolutionary ChatGPT, has announced the development of an AI-powered search engine called SearchGPT. This initiative represents a significant challenge to Google's dominance in the \$200 billion search market and marks a new chapter in the ongoing AI revolution.
- 22. World Hepatitis Day, observed annually on July 28th, serves as a global platform to raise awareness about viral hepatitis, a group of infectious diseases that cause inflammation of the liver and can lead to severe liver disease and cancer. As we approach the 2024 commemoration, the urgency of addressing this global health challenge has never been more pressing.
- 23. The capital city of India is poised to unveil a groundbreaking addition to its rich tapestry of historical attractions. On July 29, 2024, the country's first sunken museum at the Humayun's Tomb complex, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, will be inaugurated in Delhi. This innovative museum promises to offer visitors a unique perspective on Mughal history and architecture, seamlessly blending the past with cutting-edge technology.
- 24. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar unveiled a bust of Mahatma Gandhi in Tokyo's

Edogawa ward, highlighting Gandhi's global legacy and timeless message of peace and nonviolence. The event coincided with Jaishankar's visit to Japan for a Quad foreign ministers' meeting.

- 25. July 27, 2024, marks the 9th death anniversary of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, a visionary scientist, educator, and the 11th President of India. Renowned as the "Missile Man of India," Dr. Kalam made monumental contributions to aerospace engineering and defense technology, particularly through the Integrated Guided Missile Development Programme. His legacy continues to inspire generations, emphasizing integrity, humility, and perseverance.
- 26. Nita Ambani, IOC member and founder of the Reliance Foundation, inaugurated the India House during the Paris 2024 Olympics on July 27. This marks India's first-ever country house at the Olympics, highlighting a significant milestone in India's Olympic journey. In her speech, Ambani celebrated the occasion as a representation of India's Olympic ambitions and expressed hope for India to host the Games in the future.
- 27. INS Tabar, a frontline frigate of the Indian Navy, arrived in Saint Petersburg to participate in the 328th Russian Navy Day celebrations. The ship, part of the Indian Navy's Western Fleet based in Mumbai under the Western Naval Command, was warmly welcomed by the Russian Federation Navy (RuFN). The visit is set to strengthen maritime cooperation and interoperability between the two navies, aligning with India's policy of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam."
- 28. The UNESCO World Heritage committee on July 27 decided to register Japan's controversial Sado gold mine as a cultural heritage site after the country agreed to include it in an exhibit of its dark history of abusing Korean laborers during World War II. The decision signals an improvement in ties between Tokyo and Seoul.
- 29. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi chaired the 9th Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog on July 28. The Meeting was held at the

Rashtrapati Bhavan Cultural Centre, New Delhi. It was attended by Chief Ministers/Lt.Governors representing 20 States and 6 UTs.

- 30. Foreign ministers from Australia, India, Japan and the United States said on July 29, they were seriously concerned about intimidating and dangerous manoeuvres in the South China Sea and pledged to bolster maritime security in the region. The joint statement came after talks between the so-called 'Quad' countries in Tokyo, attended by Australia's Penny Wong, India's Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, Japan's Yoko Kamikawa and Antony Blinken from the U.S.
- 31. UltraTech Cement, a flagship of the Aditya Birla Group, will acquire a 32.72% equity stake in India Cements for ₹3,945 crore. The acquisition will be finalized through a Share Purchase Agreement with the promoters of India Cements, led by N. Srinivasan, pending regulatory approvals. UltraTech plans to make an open offer to India Cements shareholders at ₹390 per share after securing these approvals.
- 32. Karnataka Bank has announced a strategic partnership with ICICI Lombard General Insurance Company, enabling its customers to access a comprehensive range of insurance products. This collaboration aims to cater to various insurance needs, including health, motor, travel, and home insurance, for both individuals and businesses.
- 33. As of March 31, 2024, digital payments in India experienced a 12.6% year-over-year increase, according to the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Digital Payments Index (RBI-DPI). The index reached 445.5, marking an increase from 418.77 in September 2023 and 395.57 in March 2023. The RBI attributed this growth to improvements in payment performance and infrastructure across the country.
- 34. Manoj Mittal has taken charge as Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) of Small Industries Development Bank of India (Sidbi), following his appointment by the Government of India. Prior to this, he was the managing director (MD) of Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI).

- 35. Telangana CM Announces ₹309 Crore Development Package for Kalwakurthy. Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy attended a public meeting in Kalwakurthy to mark the death anniversary of former Union Minister S. Jaipal Reddy. The event served as a platform to honour Jaipal Reddy's contributions to Indian politics and announce a significant development package for the Kalwakurthy Assembly constituency.
- 36. Lewis Hamilton clinched victory at the 2024 Formula 1 Rolex Belgian Grand Prix under dramatic circumstances after his Mercedes team-mate George Russell, who initially crossed the finish line first, was disqualified due to a technical infringement. The disqualification stemmed from Russell's car being found underweight in the post-race inspection, a violation confirmed by a Technical Delegate's Report.
- **37.** International Tiger Day stands as a beacon of hope for one of the world's most magnificent creatures. This global initiative focuses on protecting the natural habitats of tigers and raising public awareness about their conservation. In an age where digital engagement plays a crucial role in spreading information, this day serves as a catalyst for increasing online interest in tiger-related issues.
- 38. The Ministry of Education celebrated the 4th anniversary of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 at the Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam (ABSS) 2024, held at the Manekshaw Centre Auditorium in New Delhi. The event, attended by key ministers, officials, academicians, and students, featured the release of books and lecture notes by the Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) Division. The celebration also included the launch of several significant initiatives and a series of thematic sessions on various NEP 2020-related topics.
- 39. The inaugural ceremony of 'One DAE One Subscription' (ODOS) took place on July 29, at Tata Memorial Hospital, in Mumbai. ODOS is a unique idea enabling Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) & all its units/subunits (about 60) together under one umbrella for read and

publish access to national and international research papers as well as scientific journals.

- 40. A total of 628 tigers died in India during the past five years due to natural causes and other reasons, including poaching, according to government data. Meanwhile, 349 people were killed in tiger attacks during this period, with Maharashtra alone recording 200 deaths.
- 41. In 2023, India experienced a notable reduction in average tariffs while increasing the use of non-tariff measures. According to the WTO report, India's average tariffs decreased to 17% from 18.1% in 2022. Despite this, India remained one of the top countries in initiating and imposing anti-dumping duties, second only to the US. The reduction in average tariffs contrasted with an increase in anti-dumping measures and the application of other trade defense tools.
- 42. Venezuela's National Electoral Council (CNE) announced on July 29, that Nicolas Maduro has won the presidential election once again and will govern the country from 2025 to 2031. Notably, it will be Nicolas Maduro's third time as Venezuela's President.
- 43. TIME magazine has highlighted three Indian destinations in its prestigious list of 'World's Greatest Places of 2024.' The selection celebrates places that provide fresh and unique experiences. Museum of Solutions (MuSo), a unique children's museum in Mumbai, Manam Chocolate, a factory in Hyderabad, and NAAR, a restaurant in Himachal Pradesh have been recognised in the prestigious list.
- 44. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has selected five entities for the test phase of its themeneutral fifth cohort of the regulatory sandbox, following the receipt of 22 applications. Announced in October of the previous year, this initiative allows firms to test new financial innovations in a controlled environment. Selected Entities:
 - Connectingdot Consultancy
 - Epifi Technologies
 - Finagg Technologies
 - Indian Banks' Digital Infrastructure Company (IBDIC)

- Signzy Technologies
- 45. Three prominent payment companies— Amazon Pay, Adyen, and Mumbai-based BillDesk—have secured the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) cross-border payment aggregator license. This follows Bengaluru-based Cashfree's earlier acquisition of the same license. Cashfree received its license on July 22, Adyen and Amazon Pay on July 25, and BillDesk on July 29.
- 46. The Central Water Commission (CWC) has been honoured with the GEEF Global WaterTech Award in the category 'Water Department of the Year' at the Global Water Tech Summit – 2024, held by the Global Energy and Environment Foundation (GEEF) in New Delhi.
- **47. The Asian Cricket Council (ACC)** has announced that India will host the next edition of the Men's Asia Cup cricket tournament in 2025. This significant event will be played in the T20 format, serving as a precursor to the T20 World Cup scheduled to take place in India in 2026.
- **48.** In a remarkable display of skill and precision, **Manu Bhaker and Sarabjot Singh** has secured a bronze medal in the **10m Air Pistol Mixed Team event at the Paris Olympics**. The Indian pair triumphed over South Korea's Oh Ye Jin and Lee Wonho, bringing home the second medal for India at these Games. This victory is particularly notable as it marks the second bronze for Manu Bhaker at the Paris Olympics, making her the first Indian to win two medals in a single edition of the Olympic Games since Independence.
- 49. Union Minister for Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, Shri Bhupender Yadav, launched the Ideas4LiFE portal at the Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi. This initiative seeks to gather innovative ideas related to products and services that promote environment-friendly lifestyles. The launch event was also attended by Minister of State for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Shri Kirti Vardhan Singh, and other dignitaries.
- 50. SpaceX and NASA said on July 26, they plan to launch the space agency's Crew-9 mission to

the International Space Station (ISS) no earlier than Aug. 18. The announcement comes a day after the Federal Aviation administration cleared SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket to return to space following a rare midflight failure earlier this month had grounded it.

- 51. Sudipta Sengupta, a name that resonates with groundbreaking achievements in geology and mountaineering, is the subject of a new book titled "Breaking Rocks and Barriers." Set to be released on July 24 by HarperCollins India, this book offers a captivating glimpse into the life of one of India's most remarkable women scientists and adventurers.
- 52. The International Day of Friendship is observed annually on July 30th. In 2024, this significant day will once again bring focus to the importance of friendship in fostering global peace and understanding. While the specific theme for 2024 has not been announced as of my last update in April 2024, the overarching message of the International Day of Friendship remains consistent: promoting friendship between peoples, countries, cultures, and individuals to inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities.
- 53. The 30th of July marks the annual World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, a crucial observance that brings global attention to the ongoing fight against human trafficking. This year's theme, "Leave No Child Behind in the Fight Against Human Trafficking," underscores the urgent need to protect one of society's most vulnerable groups: children.
- 54. World Nature Conservation Day 2024 is observed on Sunday, July 28. World Nature Conservation Day, observed annually, serves as a powerful reminder of our collective responsibility towards the environment. This global event emphasizes the critical need for preserving natural resources and protecting our planet's delicate ecosystems. As we approach the 2024 observance, the focus is on innovative approaches to conservation in an increasingly digital world.
- 55. 3.5 lakh A.P. Farmers Benefited From PM Fasal Bima Yojana In 2022-23. As many as

3,49,633 farmers benefited to the tune of ₹563 crore for the financial year 2022-23 under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY). The number of farmers who had enrolled themselves under the scheme from Andhra Pradesh stood at 1.23 crore and 1.31 crore respectively for the financial years 2022-23 and 2023-24, said Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Ramnath Thakur.

- 56. In a groundbreaking initiative, Periyar Tiger Reserve (PTR) in Thekkady has installed a wind turbine to power real-time monitoring cameras and Wi-Fi connectivity within its expansive forest. This move marks a significant advancement in the reserve's efforts to enhance conservation technology and communication.
- 57. Hamas's political chief Ismail Haniyeh has been assassinated in Iran's capital, Tehran. Haniyeh and one of his bodyguards were killed after the building where they were staying was struck, the statement said, adding that Haniyeh was in Tehran to attend the inauguration ceremony of Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian on July 30.
- 58. On July 29, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) introduced 'SEVA,' an Alpowered chatbot designed to assist investors with a range of functions. This initiative aims to enhance investor experience and accessibility to crucial market information.
- 59. The Uttar Pradesh Assembly on July 30, passed the UP Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion (Amendment) Bill, 2024 that enhances punishment for forced conversions. The punishment for marrying a woman by deceiving her or converting her religion was 10 years with a fine of ₹50,000. The new Bill now enhances punishment to life imprisonment.
- 60. Former Union Health Secretary Preeti Sudan is set to assume the role of Chairperson of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) on August 1, 2024. This appointment is made under Article 316 A of the Constitution, as confirmed by a government official.

- 61. The Asian Cricket Council (ACC) is poised for a significant leadership change as Mohsin Naqvi, the current chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB), is expected to assume the role of ACC president later this year.
- 62. The Ex-Servicemen Contributory Health Scheme (ECHS) has introduced the Electronic Services e-Health Assistance and Teleconsultation (E-SeHAT) module as of July 30, 2024. This initiative allows ECHS beneficiaries to receive online medical consultations from their homes, eliminating the need to visit ECHS Polyclinics. The E-SeHAT module offers structured, video-based consultations, aiming to enhance healthcare delivery for veterans by providing timely and quality medical care remotely.
- 63. The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) unveiled its new 'Suvidha Software Version 1.0' during the inaugural 'Annual Operational Sea Training Conference' held in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, on July 30, 2024. This advanced software aims to improve training protocols and maintain consistency across all ICG platforms.
- 64. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has launched the National Apprenticeship and Training Scheme (NATS)
 2.0 portal and disbursed Rs. 100 crore in stipends to apprentices via Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT). The initiative aims to enhance employability skills for young graduates and diploma holders across various sectors, including IT, manufacturing, and automobiles.
- 65. Indian students have secured two gold and three silver medals at the 54th International Physics Olympiad (IPhO) 2024 held between July 21 and July 29 in Isfahan, Iran. In the 56th International Chemistry Olympiad (IChO2024), held in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia from July 21 to 30, the Indian team bagged one gold and bronze each and two silver medals.
- 66. The year 2024 marks a significant milestone in the field of Indian epigraphy as V. Vedachalam, a renowned Tamil epigrapher and historian, receives the prestigious V Venkayya Epigraphy Award. This accolade not only recognizes Dr. Vedachalam's extensive contributions to the

field but also highlights the continuing importance of epigraphic studies in understanding India's rich historical tapestry.

67. The Government of India is implementing a ₹2,516 Crore project for the computerization of functional Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS). This initiative aims to integrate PACS with an ERP-based national software, linking them with NABARD through State Cooperative Banks (StCBs) and District Central Cooperative Banks (DCCBs). As of July 21, 2024, 25,904 PACS across 27 states and UTs are onboarded on this ERP system.

68. Shriram Capital has received in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to establish an Asset Reconstruction Company (ARC). The approval, granted after Shriram Capital's application in November 2023, marks a significant step for the company.

- 69. Indian badminton veteran Ashwini Ponnappa bid an emotional farewell to her Olympic career on July 30, 2024, at the Paris Games. The announcement came after she and her partner Tanisha Crasto faced their third consecutive defeat in the women's doubles competition.
- 70. 16-year-old Jiya Rai from Mumbai has set a new world record as the youngest and fastest para-swimmer to cross the English Channel. Suffering from Autism Spectrum Disorder, Jiya completed her 34-kilometer swim from Abbot's Cliff in England to Pointe de la Courte-Dune in France in 17 hours and 25 minutes on July 28-29, 2024.
- 71. The Basketball Federation of India (BFI) has set up the National basketball academy in collaboration with Corvuss American Academy in Mumbai. For a start, the Academy will run with 30 boys and 30 girls from the school. There will be a nationwide hunt for talent to select 30 boys and 30 girls for the academy.

- 2.
