Weekly Current Affairs

(28th January-1st February, 2024)

- 1. The 63rd gathering of the Central Geological Programming Board (CGPB) took place in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, with Shri V.L. Kantha Rao, Secretary of the Ministry of Mines, presiding. The proposed Annual Programme for the ensuing Field Season year 2024-25 was presented for discussion. The Geological Survey of India (GSI) outlined approximately 1055 scientific programs.
- 2. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is on the brink of etching her name in history books as she gears up to present her sixth consecutive Budget (Five consecutive annual **Budgets** and one interim Budget). Sitharaman's impending presentation on February 1, 2024, marks the interim Budget for the fiscal year 2024-25. This interim Budget, commonly referred to as a vote-onaccount, is pivotal in authorizing government expenditures until the advent of a new administration following the general elections slated for April-May.
- 3. In a monumental stride towards sustainability, maritime titan Maersk unveils its latest marvel: the Ane Maersk, a revolutionary container vessel powered by green methanol derived from green hydrogen. The Ane Maersk represents a bold leap into a greener future, boasting the title of the world's largest container vessel fueled by green methanol, a derivative of green hydrogen.
- 4. In a groundbreaking turn of events, Kenneth Smith, a convicted murderer, has become the first person in the United States to be executed by nitrogen gas. The execution, which took place in Alabama, introduces a new method intended to be the most painless and humane alternative to the previously predominant lethal injection. This move has positioned Alabama as a trailblazer in

- adopting nitrogen gas for capital punishment, joining the ranks of only a few states to approve this controversial method.
- 5. In a significant development, Zomato Payments Private Limited, the subsidiary of popular food delivery platform Zomato, has obtained the much-coveted payment aggregator (PA) license from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).
- 6. In a positive turn, ICRA has revised its bank credit growth estimates for FY24 upwards to 14.9-15.3%, surpassing the previous projection of 12.8-13.0%. The incremental credit is expected to reach Rs 20.4-20.9 trillion, marking the highest ever in bank credit growth, surpassing the previous high of Rs 18.2 trillion in FY23.
- 7. Air India, a subsidiary of the Tata Group, incurred a hefty fine of Rs 1.1 crore from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), the country's aviation regulator, for safety breaches. This penalty was imposed following a pilot's report concerning insufficient emergency oxygen supply on Air India's B777 aircraft, which are crucially utilized for longrange flights.
- 8. In a significant development, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted approval to Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) for acquiring up to 9.99% aggregate holding in HDFC Bank, the nation's largest private sector bank. The RBI stipulates that LIC must ensure its aggregate holding in HDFC Bank does not surpass 9.99% of the paid-up share capital or voting rights at any given time.
- 9. The Union Cabinet, on January 24, 2024, gave the green light to a groundbreaking Viability Gap Funding (VGF) scheme, allocating Rs 8,500 crores for Coal Gasification Projects. The VGF scheme is designed with precision,

- dividing the funding into three categories. Government-owned companies, spearheading three key projects, are set to receive a substantial grant of Rs 4,050 crores.
- 10. In a groundbreaking move for the Indian tech landscape, Bhavish Aggarwal, the visionary behind Ola, has successfully raised \$50 million for his latest venture, Krutrim. Krutrim, cofounded by Bhavish Aggarwal, has swiftly emerged as a prominent player in the realm of Artificial Intelligence. Aggarwal, renowned for his innovative contributions through Ola and Ola Electric, now brings his tech prowess to the Al domain with Krutrim.
- 11. The United Nations General Assembly designated January 27 as the International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust in November 2005, with resolution 60/7. This date was chosen to mark the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp, in 1945.
- 12. International Day of Clean Energy, observed on January 26, is a significant day dedicated to promoting the importance of renewable energy for a sustainable and environmentally friendly future.
- 13. Every year, on January 26, we celebrate International Customs Day, a special day dedicated to recognizing and appreciating the crucial role played by customs agencies worldwide.
- 14. National Geographic Day 2024 is celebrated on January 27 every year.
- 15. In a significant development, REC Ltd, a Maharatna power finance company, has been designated as the nodal agency for the ambitious Pradhan Mantri Suryoday Yojana. This initiative, announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on January 22, aims to install rooftop solar panels in one crore households.
- 16. India's ACME Group and Japan's IHI Corporation have inked a groundbreaking deal for the supply of 0.4 million metric tons per annum (MMTPA) of green ammonia from Odisha, India, to Japan. The signing ceremony witnessed the presence of notable figures, including Union Minister R. K. Singh and

- Ambassador Hiroshi Suzuki, emphasizing the strategic importance of the collaboration.
- 17. Indian tennis star Rohan Bopanna has etched his name in the history books by becoming the oldest player to claim the No. 1 spot in the men's doubles rankings at the age of 43. This remarkable achievement was secured following his quarter-final victory at the 2024 Australian Open, alongside Australia's Matthew Ebden.
- 18. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Diamond Jubilee celebration of the Supreme Court of India and unveiled key technology initiatives during the event held at the Supreme Court auditorium in Delhi. The occasion marked the beginning of the Supreme Court's 75th year, coinciding with the 75th year of the Indian Constitution.
- 19. Prime Minister Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for projects worth over Rs 19,100 crores in Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh. The diverse projects spanned crucial sectors such as rail, road, oil and gas, and urban development. One significant project is dedication of a 173 Km long double line electrified section between New Khurja New Rewari on Dedicated Freight Corridor. Moreover, Inauguration of the fourth line connecting Mathura Palwal section & Chipiyana Buzurg Dadri section.
- 20. French President Emmanuel Macron concluded his two-day visit to India, participating as the chief guest in the 75th **Republic Day celebrations**. The visit aimed at strengthening strategic ties between India and France, featuring a 40-member delegation and significant diplomatic engagements.
- 21. The vibrant hues of oranges and the aroma of citrus filled the air as the 4th edition of the Rüsoma Orange Festival unfolded in the picturesque village of Rüsoma, nestled in the Kohima district in Nagaland. With approximately 3400 attendees, this year's event showcased the best of organic produce, community spirit, and rural entrepreneurship.
- **22.** The inaugural joint military exercise, **Sada Tanseeq**, between the armies of India and Saudi Arabia, is poised to commence in

- Rajasthan, showcasing a significant leap in bilateral relations between India and Saudi Arabia. Scheduled from January 29th to February 10th, 2024, Sada Tanseeq signifies a landmark collaboration, epitomizing the growing strategic partnership between India and Saudi Arabia. The Saudi Arabian contingent, comprising 45 personnel, is being represented by the esteemed Royal Saudi Land Forces. Simultaneously, the Indian Army contingent, also consisting of 45 personnel, proudly represents a Battalion from the Brigade of the Guards (Mechanised Infantry).
- 23. In a significant turn of events ahead of the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, Janata Dal-United (JDU) chief Nitish Kumar was sworn in as Bihar Chief Minister for the ninth time, breaking ties with the 'Mahagathbandhan' and securing support from the BJP.
- 24. On February 1, 2024, as part of the legislature's budget session, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will deliver the Union Budget 2024 for the fiscal year 2024–2025. The budget aims to strike a balance between economic development and financial consolidation. The fiscal deficit target for FY24 is 5.9% of GDP, as suggested by CII, with a further reduction to about 5.4% of GDP for FY25.
- 25. Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA), a Government of India enterprise under the administrative control of the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, has taken a remarkable step towards fostering transparency and promoting renewable energy initiatives. On January 25, 2024, IREDA unveiled 'Pahal,' the insightful house journal of its Vigilance Department, marking a significant milestone in its commitment to accountability and sustainability.
- 26. Indian Newspaper Day, observed on January 28th each year, is a tribute to the rich legacy of journalism in the country. It marks the inception of newspapers in India, a historic moment when James Augustus Hicky introduced the first printed newspaper, Hicky's Bengal Gazette, in 1780.
- 27. On January 28, we celebrate the birth anniversary of Field Marshal Kodandera M.

- **Cariappa**, the inaugural Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Army. Recognized as a national hero, Cariappa's pivotal role in shaping the Indian military from colonial to independent India remains revered.
- 28. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on the occasion of the Ayodhya Ram Mandir consecration, announced a significant initiative, "Pradhanmantri Suryodaya Yojana." This ambitious project is designed to boost solar energy usage in India and marks a significant step towards energy self-reliance and sustainability.
- 29. The All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) 2021-22, released by the Ministry of Education, unveils a significant spike in higher education enrollment. The total enrollment soared from 4.14 crore in the previous session to nearly 4.33 crore in 2021-22, marking a notable uptick of 19 lakh students.
- 30. The 'INDIA AGEING REPORT 2023,' jointly conducted by the International Institute for Population Sciences and the United Nations Population Fund, provides a comprehensive overview of the aging demographic in Jammu Kashmir. Jammu Kashmir emerges as a region with remarkable resilience against elderly poverty, boasting a mere 4.2 percent of its aged population falling below the poverty line.
- as French Defence Minister Sebastien
 Locornu and India's National Security Advisor
 Ajit Doval sealed the Defence Space
 Agreement on January 26. The Defence Space
 Partnership signifies a paradigm shift,
 enhancing the collaboration between India
 and France in space defence. This agreement
 opens avenues for joint development and
 deployment of military satellites, bolstering
 offensive and defensive capabilities.
- 32. The 69th edition of the Filmfare Awards 2024 took place in Gandhinagar, Gujarat. The Filmfare Awards 2024 celebrated the finest achievements in Indian cinema. The event featured hosting by Karan Johar, and performances by Kareena Kapoor, Karisma Kapoor, Varun Dhawan, and Kartik Aaryan among others.

- 33. India finished as runner-up at the inaugural edition of the FIH Hockey 5s Women's World Cup after a 7-2 loss to the Netherlands in the final in Muscat.
- 34. Jannik Sinner secured his first Grand Slam in men's singles, while Aryna Sabalenka claimed her second in women's singles. Rohan Bopanna, at 43, became the oldest man to win men's doubles. Hsieh Su-Wei and Elise Mertens won women's doubles, and Hsieh, with Jan Zielinski, clinched mixed doubles.
- 35. Hyderabad's Tanmay Agarwal scored an unbeaten 323 off just 160 balls against Arunachal Pradesh in the Ranji Trophy Plate Group game. His innings included 33 fours and 21 sixes, showcasing his aggressive batting style.
- 36. On January 27, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced that it has successfully executed all experiments within the Payload Orbital Experiment for Microgravity (POEM-3) mission, which was launched as part of the PSLV-C58 mission. POEM-3 represents a remarkable feat in India's space endeavors, leveraging the capabilities of the PSLV-C58 vehicle to create an efficient and versatile space platform. Launched alongside XPoSat on January 1, 2024, POEM-3 exemplifies India's innovative approach to space exploration.
- 37. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to launch its latest meteorological satellite, INSAT-3DS, marking a significant advancement in India's space capabilities. This satellite, designed to enhance weather forecasting and disaster management, represents a culmination of rigorous testing and collaboration between ISRO and various stakeholders.
- **38.** The Republic Day Parade 2024 witnessed a remarkable tableau that captured the essence of India as the **'Mother of Democracy**.' The winning tableau was based on the theme 'India: Mother of Democracy,' showcasing the country's long-standing tradition of democratic values and practices.
- 39. On the 75th Republic Day, THDC India Limited (THDCIL), a prominent Power Sector PSU, proudly unveiled India's Largest Electrolyser

- End Fuel Cell-based Green Hydrogen Pilot Project at its office complex in Rishikesh. The initiative aligns with the "National Green Hydrogen Mission," showcasing THDCIL's commitment to sustainable energy practices. The pilot project, utilizing a 1MW Rooftop Solar Plant, will produce 50KG of Green Hydrogen daily.
- 40. In a disputed electoral process, Comoros President Azali Assoumani has claimed victory for a fourth term with 63% of the vote, as announced by the electoral body Ceni. Azali Assoumani, a former military officer who first seized power in 1999, secured his fourth term after a contentious 2018 referendum abolished term limits. Accusations of imprisoning and exiling opponents have marred his rule, with critics raising concerns about democratic principles.
- 41. Bhutan's liberal leader, Tshering Tobgay, from the People's Democratic Party (PDP), has commenced his second term as prime minister, following recent elections in the nation.
- 42. The National Chilika Birds Festival, a hallmark event in Odisha's calendar, commenced with grandeur on January 26.

 The festival was inaugurated by Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik
- 43. In a significant move towards the development and empowerment of approximately one crore tribals in Odisha, the state government, led by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, has approved the launch of the 'LABHA' scheme. LABHA, an acronym for Laghu Bana Jatya Drabya Kraya, is a 100% state-funded Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Minor Forest Produce (MFP).
- **44.** India has nominated the **'Maratha Military Landscapes'** for inclusion in the UNESCO
 World Heritage List for the 2024-25 cycle.
- 45. Mrs. Nirmala Sitharaman, the Finance Minister, is set to present her 6th budget on this occasion. The upcoming Union Budget on 1st February 2024 marks the 15th interim budget. The infrastructure sector in India is anticipated to achieve a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 9.57 percent from 2024 to 2029.

- 46. In a strategic move, Bank of Baroda's whollyowned subsidiary for cards, 'BOB Financial
 Solutions Limited', has undergone a
 rebranding, emerging as 'BOBCARD Limited'
 with the tagline "Credit Reimagined." The
 transformation includes a distinctive logo
 named 'Baroda Sun,' featuring dual 'B'
 letterforms enveloping the rays of a rising
 sun.
- 47. Toyota, the renowned Japanese automaker, has once again secured its position as the world's top-selling automaker in 2023. This achievement underscores Toyota's continued dominance in the global automotive market and its commitment to innovation, quality, and customer satisfaction.
- 48. GAIL, India's leading gas company, has made significant strides in enhancing its liquefied natural gas (LNG) portfolio through a recent partnership with the United Arab Emirates' (UAE) ADNOC Gas. Under this deal, GAIL is set to procure 0.5 million tonnes of LNG annually for a decade, marking a crucial step towards meeting India's growing demand for natural gas.
- 49. India commemorates Martyrs' Day, also known as Shaheed Diwas, on January 30th each year. This day holds a dual significance as it marks the assassination of Mahatma Gandhi, the "Father of the Nation," and also serves to honour all the brave souls who sacrificed their lives for the country's freedom and sovereignty.
- 50. World Leprosy Day, observed annually on the last Sunday of January, is a crucial event dedicated to raising awareness about leprosy, also known as Hansen's Disease.
- **51.** In a major stride within the energy sector, **QatarEnergy and Excelerate Energy** have finalized a pivotal 15-year LNG Sale and Purchase Agreement (SPA) with the goal of providing LNG to Bangladesh. Under the SPA, Excelerate will secure up to one million tons per annum (MTPA) of LNG from QatarEnergy. The deliveries, set to commence from January 2026, will be directed to floating storage and regasification units in Bangladesh.
- **52. Sharat Chauhan, a seasoned 1994 batch IAS** officer of the AGMUT cadre, has been

- designated as the new **Chief Secretary of Puducherry**.
- 53. Sonam Maskar made a remarkable debut in the shooting World Cup in Cairo, Egypt, clinching the women's air rifle silver medal. Despite her impressive performance, she was narrowly beaten by Anna Janssen of Germany by a mere 0.9 points.
- 54. Indian boxer Mandeep Jangra secured a remarkable triumph at the US-based National Boxing Association's (NBA) intercontinental super featherweight championship. His win came after a compelling bout against American Gerardo Esquivel in Toppenish City, Washington. Jangra, showcased exceptional skill as he transitioned from his previous 75kg weight class to compete for the intercontinental super featherweight title.
- 55. Naorem Roshibina Devi, the pride of Manipur, has clinched the prestigious title of International Wushu Federation Female Athlete of the Year, solidifying her place as a powerhouse in the world of wushu.
- 56. Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma released the first edition of 'Political History of Assam (1947-1971)'- Volume 1, marking a significant step in documenting the state's political journey.
- 57. 'Ek Samandar, Mere Andar,' a collection of 75 poems penned by BrahMos Aerospace Deputy CEO Sanjeev Joshi, was launched in a prestigious event graced by top Indian defence and literary figures.
- 58. In a significant development on January 1, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, Iran, and Ethiopia officially joined the BRICS group, expanding its membership to ten nations.
- 59. In a significant political development, Champai Soren has been announced as the next Chief Minister of Jharkhand, following the resignation of Hemant Soren.
- 60. Madhya Pradesh CM Mohan Yadav announced the green light for IIT Indore's Ujjain satellite campus, marking a pivotal moment for education and skill development. The approval of IIT Indore's Ujjain satellite campus underscores the government's

- commitment to enhancing educational opportunities.
- 61. Tamil Nadu has set a new benchmark in environmental conservation and biodiversity protection by securing two more Ramsar sites, thus achieving the highest number of such designated areas in the country. The recent addition of the Longwood Shola Reserve Forest in The Nilgiris and the Karaivetti Bird Sanctuary in Ariyalur has propelled the state to the forefront of ecological conservation efforts in India.
- 62. Assam, under the leadership of Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, advances with key decisions: The Assam Tourism Development and Registration Bill 2024 and the Mising Autonomous Council Amendment Bill 2024. The Assam Tourism Development and Registration Bill 2024 is set for introduction in the upcoming Legislative Assembly session, aims to regulate and boost tourism.
- 63. At the Vijay Chowk on January 29, the Beating Retreat ceremony, which signifies the end of Republic Day celebrations, began amid the strains of beautiful music. The traditional 'buggy' that President and Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces Droupadi Murmu arrived at the location in added to the event's vintage charm, which dates back to its inception in the early 1950s.
- **64.** On February 3, **Visakhapatnam's Naval Dockyard** will witness a momentous occasion as Defence Minister Rajnath Singh presides over the commissioning ceremony of **INS Sandhayak. Built by the GRSE in Kolkata**, the 110-meter-long INS Sandhayak displaces about 3,800 tonnes and boasts an impressive 80 percent indigenous content.
- 65. Havildar Preeti Rajak, a distinguished trap shooter in the Indian Army, has reached a historic milestone by being promoted to the esteemed rank of Subedar. She becomes the first woman in the Indian Army to hold this prestigious rank, signifying not only her personal accomplishment but also a significant advancement for women in the armed forces.
- 66. Transformation of Indian Economy: Led by the visionary leadership of Hon'ble Prime

- Minister Shri Narendra Modi, our government has navigated through significant challenges, implementing structural reforms and pro-people programs with the motto of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'.
- 67. In the Budget for the fiscal year 2024-25, the Union Government demonstrates a robust commitment to bolstering economic growth through substantial investments infrastructure development. The total expenditure in the Budget is estimated at 47,65,768 crore(47.65 Lakh Crore), with a significant focus on capital expenditure, reaching 11,11,111 crore(11.11 Lakh Crore). This reflects a commendable increase of 16.9% in capital expenditure over the Revised Estimates (RE) for 2023-24.
- 68. As the political landscape gears up for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections in India, discussions surrounding the country's financial planning take center stage. Central to this discourse are the distinctions between the interim budget and the full union budget, two crucial fiscal documents that guide the nation's economic trajectory. The interim budget serves as a temporary financial plan presented by the incumbent government when its term is ending or during a transition of power. It is a stopgap arrangement designed to ensure the smooth functioning of the government until a new administration assumes office.
- 69. In a commendable financial feat, the Centre reported a 10.4% surge in Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue for January, reaching an impressive ₹1,72,129 crore. This milestone represents the second-highest GST collection ever recorded, with the ₹1.7 lakh crore benchmark surpassed for the third time in the fiscal year 2023-24.
- 70. India's core sector output growth plummeted to a 14-month low of 3.8% YoY in December, as reported by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. This sharp decline from the previous month's 7.9% was attributed to a high base and a slowdown in six constituent sectors. Notably, only fertilizers (5.8%) and cement (1.3%) sectors saw an output acceleration in December.

- 71. In a significant move, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed major business restrictions on Paytm Payments Bank, effective from February 29. The RBI directive prohibits Paytm Payments Bank from accepting fresh deposits, credit transactions, or top-ups in customer accounts, including prepaid instruments such as wallets and FASTags, after February 29.
- 72. The first-ever Mangalore Beachside Startup Fest is set to unfold from February 16th to 18th, marking a significant milestone in the region's entrepreneurial landscape. With a focus on nurturing and promoting nascent ventures, this event promises to be a catalyst for the burgeoning startup ecosystem in Mangalore.
- 73. Every year on February 1st, India celebrates the Indian Coast Guard Day, a tribute to the valour, dedication, and service of the personnel safeguarding the country's maritime interests. The day honours the relentless efforts of the Coast Guard officers and personnel in maintaining maritime security and responding to emergencies at sea.
- 74. The prestigious Blavatnik Awards will recognize the exceptional contributions of Rahul R Nair, Mehul Malik, Tanmay Bharat, and other early career scientists at a black-tie gala in London on February 27. These awards, totaling 480,000 pounds in grants, underscore the importance of recognition and research funding in propelling scientific breakthroughs.
