- 1. The third edition of the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign, aimed at fostering patriotism and national pride by encouraging citizens to display the national flag at their homes, will run from August 9 to August 15. This initiative has seen significant public participation in the past two years, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi urging citizens to continue the tradition.
- 2. The West Bengal government and UNICEF have teamed up to encourage fathers to play an active role in promoting breastfeeding among new mothers. This initiative aims to enhance family support for breastfeeding and improve the rates of exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of a child's life.
- 3. The Indian women's national volleyball team has once again proven their mettle on the international stage by clinching the gold medal at the 4th CAVA (Central Asian Volleyball Association) Women's Volleyball Nations League. In a thrilling final match, India overcame the host nation Nepal with a score of 3-2 sets, marking their second CAVA title. This prestigious event took place at the Dasharath Stadium in Kathmandu, Nepal, culminating on August 7, 2024.
- 4. In a recent political shakeup, Tunisia's President Kais Saied has dismissed Prime Minister Ahmed Hachani and appointed Kamel Maddouri, the former Social Affairs Minister, to the role. This change marks the sixth prime ministerial appointment under Saied's administration. The announcement

- comes just before Tunisia's presidential election on October 6, amid growing social and economic unrest.
- 5. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced a significant change in the reporting frequency for credit information from monthly to every 15 days. This update, effective from now, aims to enhance the accuracy and timeliness of credit data available to lenders and borrowers alike.
- 6. Setu, a Pine Labs-owned API infrastructure provider, has launched UPISetu in collaboration with Axis Bank. This new platform focuses on Unified Payments Interface (UPI) solutions, catering to businesses and developers with a variety of UPI products and advanced functionalities.
- 7. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has approved Praveena Rai's appointment as the Managing Director and CEO of the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX), India's largest commodity exchange. This decision comes after a three-month vacancy in the position.
- 8. Indian-origin top Singapore banker Piyush Gupta is set to step down as the Chief Executive Officer of the DBS Group in March 2025. He will be succeeded by Tan Su Shan, who was appointed Deputy CEO yesterday, in addition to being Group Head, Institutional Banking, at DBS.
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to celebrate its 55th foundation day on August 15, 2024, with a significant

- milestone the launch of the Earth Observation Satellite-08 (EOS-08). This event not only commemorates ISRO's long-standing contribution to space science but also showcases India's growing capabilities in satellite technology and space exploration.
- 10. Central banks are the backbone of a nation's financial system, playing a pivotal role in maintaining economic stability and fostering growth. Their primary responsibilities include implementing stable monetary policies and ensuring financial stability. As we delve into the rankings of the world's wealthiest central banks in 2024, we gain valuable insights into the global economic landscape and the financial prowess of various nations.
- 11. Neeraj Chopra, the reigning Olympic champion, put on an impressive display at the Paris Olympics, winning the silver medal in the men's javelin throw event. Chopra's season-best throw of 89.45m earned him the runner-up position, but he was unable to defend his title, as Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem broke the Olympic record with a stunning throw of 92.97m.
- 12. In a thrilling encounter, the Indian men's hockey team secured the bronze medal at the Paris 2024 Olympics after defeating Spain 2-1 in the third-place match at the Yves du Manoir Stadium in Paris on Thursday. This victory marks a significant milestone for Indian hockey, as the team secured its first back-to-back Olympic medals since the 1972 Munich Games.
- 13. The International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples is a globally recognized event that shines a spotlight on the unique cultures, challenges, and contributions of indigenous communities worldwide. As we approach the 2024 celebration, it's crucial to understand the significance of this day and its impact on promoting indigenous rights and preserving cultural heritage.
- 14. Nagasaki Day is an annual observance that commemorates one of the most devastating events in human history the atomic bombing of Nagasaki, Japan, during World War II. This solemn occasion serves as a powerful reminder

- of the catastrophic consequences of nuclear warfare and underscores the critical importance of global peace and disarmament efforts.
- 15. Chinese-American physicist Tsung-Dao Lee, who in 1957 became the second-youngest scientist to receive a Nobel Prize, died on August 4, at his home in San Francisco at age 97. Prof. Lee, whose work advanced the understanding of particle physics, was one of the great masters in the field.
- 16. The Indian Cost Accounts Service (ICoAS) celebrated its Foundation Day in New Delhi with the theme 'ICoAS @ Viksit Bharat'. The event highlighted the crucial role of ICoAS officers in shaping the economic future of India by 2047. Dr. T. V. Somanathan, Finance Secretary & Secretary (Expenditure), was the Chief Guest and emphasized the importance of ICoAS officers in realizing the vision of a developed India.
- 17. The Union Cabinet on August 9, approved eight new railway projects at an estimated cost of ₹24,657 crore to provide connectivity, facilitate ease of travelling, minimise logistics cost, reduce oil imports and lower carbon dioxide emissions.
- 18. The city of Kozhikode in Kerala, India, is set to receive a significant upgrade to its waste management infrastructure. Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, in collaboration with the Habitat Charitable Trust, has proposed the construc Thetion of a state-of-the-art faecal sludge treatment plant (FSTP) at Sarovaram. This development marks a crucial step towards improving sanitation and water hygiene in the region.
- 19. With its tiger population plunging in recent years, Chhattisgarh on August 7, cleared a long-pending proposal to notify a new tiger reserve the third largest in the country. The Guru Ghasidas-Tamor Pingla Tiger Reserve, which integrates an existing national park with a wildlife sanctuary, is Chhattisgarh's fourth reserve for the big cats. It spans 2,829 square kilometres across four northern districts of the state.

- 20. Odisha has introduced India's first round-the-clock grain dispensing machine, known as the Annapurti Grain ATM, designed to transform the Public Distribution System (PDS) for ration cardholders. Officially launched by Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister Krushna Chandra Patra, this innovative machine is located at a warehouse in Mancheswar and developed in collaboration with the World Food Programme.
- 21. The Reserve Bank has revamped the cheque truncation system (CTS), which currently processes cheques with a clearing cycle of up to two working days, to improve the efficiency of cheque clearing and reduce settlement risk for participants, apart from enhancing customer experience.
- 22. In response to the volatile situation in Bangladesh, the Indian government has established a committee to monitor the Indo-Bangladesh border and ensure the safety of Indian nationals and minority communities in the neighboring country. The committee will maintain communication with Bangladeshi authorities and oversee security measures at the border.
- 23. The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has announced that hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh and pistol shooter Manu Bhaker will be the co-flag bearers for India at the closing ceremony of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. This decision highlights Sreejesh's illustrious career and Bhaker's recent achievements.
- 24. As August 11th approaches, the global community prepares to celebrate the inaugural World Steelpan Day in 2024. This momentous occasion marks a significant milestone in recognizing the cultural and historical importance of the steelpan, a unique musical instrument that originated in Trinidad and Tobago. The United Nations' endorsement of this day underscores the steelpan's role not only in music but also in promoting cultural diversity and sustainable development.
- 25. World Lion Day, celebrated annually on August 10th, marks a crucial moment in wildlife conservation efforts. As we approach the 2024 edition, the urgency to protect these

- majestic creatures has never been more pressing. Lions, scientifically known as Panthera leo, are not just symbols of strength and courage but play a vital role in maintaining ecological balance. This article delves into the significance of World Lion Day 2024 and the ongoing efforts to ensure the survival of these magnificent big cats.
- 26. The academic community mourns the loss of H. Devaraj, former Vice-Chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC), who passed away at the age of 71. His death marks the end of a remarkable career that spanned decades and left an indelible mark on India's higher education landscape.
- 27. As of August 7, 2024, Punjab, Telangana, Kerala, and West Bengal have yet to implement the Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009. Union Minister of State for Education, Jayant Chowdhary, disclosed this in the Rajya Sabha. Education is on the concurrent list, giving states the authority to create rules under the RTE Act, but these states have not yet done so.
- 28. The Society for Applied Microwave **Electronics** Engineering & Research (SAMEER), an R&D institute under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), has signed a Transfer of Technology (ToT) agreement with Toshniwal Hyvac Pvt. Ltd. and Sir Automation Industries. This agreement will facilitate the large-scale manufacturing of a state-of-the-art Microwave-Based Brix Measurement System, designed to measure sugar concentration (Brix) in real-time during sugar production.
- 29. India is on the brink of commissioning its second nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarine, INS Arighat, and has received approval to construct six additional nuclear submarines to enhance its maritime defence. The Indian Navy is preparing to commission INS Arighat, its second nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarine (SSBN), which is nearing the completion of its trials and upgrades.
- **30. Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal** has announced the restoration of the Diamond Imprest Licence, a move aimed at

- revitalizing India's gems and jewellery sector. The decision was made during the India International Jewellery Show (IIJS) 2024, organized by the Gem and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC). This policy shift is expected to address issues related to diamond imports and enhance India's export competitiveness.
- 31. India and New Zealand have signed a Bilateral Customs Cooperation Arrangement to facilitate easier trade between the two nations. The agreement was formalized in Wellington on 8 August 2024 during President Droupadi Murmu's official visit to New Zealand.
- 32. NPCI International Payments Limited (NIPL)
 has achieved a major milestone by surpassing
 100,000 cross-border Unified Payments
 Interface (UPI) Person-to-Merchant (P2M)
 transactions in Nepal, the NIPL said in a
 statement. NIPL is an international arm of the
 National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI).
- appointed as the new Cabinet Secretary of India, succeeding Rajiv Gauba, whose term ends this month. Somanathan will begin his two-year tenure on August 30, 2024. He will also serve as Officer on Special Duty (OSD) in the Cabinet Secretariat until he formally assumes the role of Cabinet Secretary.
- 34. Bollywood's charismatic 'King Khan', graced the 77th Locarno Film Festival with his presence on August 10, receiving a career achievement award that further gilds his storied career. Shah Rukh delivered his acceptance speech to a rapt audience of 8,000 at Locarno's famed Piazza Grande.
- 35. Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harivansh Narayan Singh attended the launch of '75 Great Revolutionaries of India,' a book by MP Bhim Singh. Singh praised the work for highlighting lesser-known freedom fighters. The book aims to inspire a developed India by recognizing historical sacrifices.
- 36. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), the commercial arm of ISRO, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to

- facilitate the launch of Nepal's Munal satellite. The MoU was formalized on Saturday, with Anurag Srivastava, Joint Secretary (North) from MEA, and Arunachalam A, Director from NSIL, representing their respective organizations.
- 37. The bilateral air exercise "Udara Shakti 2024" between the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the Royal Malaysian Air Force (RMAF) concluded successfully on August 9, 2024. This exercise, hosted by the RMAF at its base in Kuantan, Malaysia, marked a significant milestone in military cooperation between the two nations.
- 38. Susan Wojcicki, a pioneering figure in the tech industry and former CEO of YouTube, has passed away at the age of 56 following a two-year battle with cancer. The news of her death was confirmed by her husband, Dennis Troper, on August 9. Susan Diane Wojcicki was an American business executive who was the chief executive officer of YouTube from 2014 to 2023. Her net worth was estimated at \$765 million in 2022.
- 39. Former External Affairs Minister Natwar Singh passed away at 95, due to a prolonged illness on August 10. He took his last breath at Medanta Hospital in Gurugram near Delhi, where he was admitted for the past couple of weeks.
- 40. World Biofuel Day, observed annually on August 10th, commemorates the groundbreaking achievement of German engineer Sir Rudolf Diesel, who successfully operated an engine using peanut oil on August 9, 1893. This day serves as a global platform to highlight the significance of biofuels as a sustainable energy source and their potential in addressing climate change and reducing dependence on fossil fuels.
- 41. International Youth Day, observed annually on August 12th, is a global celebration that recognizes the contributions of young people to society and addresses the challenges they face. The day serves as a platform to raise awareness about socio-economic and socio-political issues affecting youth worldwide. The 2024 theme, "From Clicks to Progress: Youth Digital Pathways for Sustainable Development," highlights the crucial role of

- digital technologies in advancing the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- 42. The Neelakurinji (Strobilanthes kunthiana), a remarkable flowering shrub native to the montane grasslands of southwest India, has recently been added to the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List of Threatened Species. This iconic plant, known for its mass blooming once every 12 years, has been classified as Vulnerable according to the IUCN criteria.
- 43. In a significant development for India's hydroelectric power sector, NHPC Limited has announced the appointment of Shri Raj Kumar Chaudhary as its new Chairman & Managing Director. This appointment marks a crucial milestone for the company, bringing on board a leader with extensive experience and a proven track record in hydroelectric power development.
- 44. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has introduced stricter regulations for Housing Finance Companies (HFCs) to bring their public deposit norms in line with those for Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs). This move aims to enhance regulatory parity between the two sectors.
- 45. Bharti Global, the international investment arm of Bharti Enterprises, is set to acquire a 24.5% stake in the British telecom giant BT Group plc for approximately \$4 billion. The shares will be purchased through Bharti Televentures UK Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Bharti Global. The deal signifies a major expansion of Bharti's global telecom ambitions and is expected to enhance India-UK bilateral relations.
- 46. India's retail inflation rate, as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), fell to 3.54% in July, reaching a nearly 5-year low. This decline is attributed to a high base effect and a significant drop in food prices. The inflation rate has dipped below the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) medium-term target of 4% for the first time since August 2019. Despite this, the RBI is expected to maintain its current policy stance.

- 47. The Mitra Shakti military exercise, an annual bilateral engagement between the Indian Army and the Sri Lankan Army, commenced on August 12, 2024. This year's exercise, held at the Sri Lankan Army Training School in Maduru Oya, marks a significant milestone in the military cooperation between these two South Asian nations. Set to run until August 25, this combined training exercise exemplifies the commitment of both countries to enhance their military capabilities and foster stronger bilateral relations.
- 48. Union Minister for Education Shri Dharmendra Pradhan on August 12, released the India Rankings 2024, which implements the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) drafted for this purpose by the Ministry of Education in 2015. According to the last year's ranking, IIT Madras secured the top spot in the 'overall' category, followed by IISc Bengaluru and IIT Delhi in second and third place respectively.
- 49. Every year on August 12th, people around the globe observe World Elephant Day. This annual event aims to raise awareness about the challenges faced by the world's largest land mammals. Elephants, often referred to as pachyderms, play a crucial role in our ecosystems and hold significant cultural importance in many societies.
- year on August 13 to raise awareness about the importance of organ donation and encourage people to register as organ donors. Organ Donation Day serves as a crucial reminder of the importance of this life-saving act. In India, the government has taken significant steps to promote organ donation through nationwide campaigns and educational programs. These initiatives aim to dispel myths, raise awareness about the critical need for organs, and educate the public on the donation process.
- **51. China** has taken a significant step in advancing its low-altitude economy by testing its largest unmanned cargo aircraft yet. This move highlights the country's push to expand its

- drone capabilities, with the goal of creating a **\$279-billion industry by 2030**.
- 52. The state of Madhya Pradesh, under the leadership of Dr Mohan Yadav, has taken a revolutionary step in addressing menstrual health and hygiene. In a first-of-its-kind move in India, the state government has launched a scheme to provide cash directly to adolescent girls for purchasing sanitary napkins. This innovative approach sets Madhya Pradesh apart from other states that typically distribute free sanitary napkins.
- 53. Rana Ashutosh Kumar Singh has been appointed as the Managing Director (MD) of the State Bank of India (SBI), overseeing the Risk Compliance and Stressed Assets Resolution Group (SARG) departments. This change follows government approval last week.
- 54. Hockey India (HI) has officially announced that retiring goalkeeper PR Sreejesh will be the new head coach for the Indian junior men's hockey team. This decision follows India's recent bronze medal victory at the 2024 Olympics.
- 55. The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) is spinning off its Bharat Interface for Money (BHIM) app into a standalone subsidiary to bolster its presence in the digital payments market. Lalitha Nataraj, previously with IDFC FIRST Bank and ICICI Bank, has been appointed as CEO of this new entity.
- 56. State-owned Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) has been awarded a significant contract by Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) to set up a 1,600 MW thermal power project. This project, known as the Koderma Supercritical Thermal Power Project (STPP), will be implemented on an Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) basis in the Koderma district of Jharkhand.
- 57. In a significant step towards driving Digital Health education across India, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the National Health Authority (NHA) and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS) in the presence of Union Health Minister, Shri J P Nadda, on August 13.

- 58. The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) on August 13, 2024 successfully carried out the maiden flight test of the long-range glide bomb (LRGB) Gaurav from a Su-30 MK-I fighter jet of the Indian Air Force.
- 59. The International Cricket Council (ICC) has revealed the recipients of the ICC Players of the Month awards for July 2024. England's Gus Atkinson and Sri Lanka's Chamari Athapaththu have been crowned as the standout performers in men's and women's cricket, respectively, for their exceptional contributions to the sport during the month.
- 60. The Big Cricket League (BCL) is set to make its debut on the Indian cricket landscape, promising a unique blend of local talent and cricketing legends. This franchise-based T20 event is poised to offer aspiring players an unprecedented opportunity to showcase their skills alongside established stars, potentially reshaping the future of Indian cricket. In a significant move, the BCL has forged a long-term partnership with Prasar Bharati, India's national public broadcaster. This collaboration marks a crucial step in ensuring the league's visibility and accessibility across the country.
- 61. Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, known in Hindi as "Vibhajan Vibhishika Smriti Diwas," is a solemn national memorial day observed annually on August 14th in India. This day serves as a poignant reminder of the immense suffering and loss experienced during the 1947 partition of India. Established in 2021 by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, this commemoration aims to honor the victims and acknowledge the profound impact of partition on millions of lives.
- 62. In a groundbreaking discovery, archaeologists may have uncovered the world's oldest solar calendar at the renowned archaeological site of Göbekli Tepe in southern Turkey. This finding, published in the journal Time and Mind on July 24, offers a fascinating glimpse into the sophisticated astronomical knowledge of our ancient ancestors.
